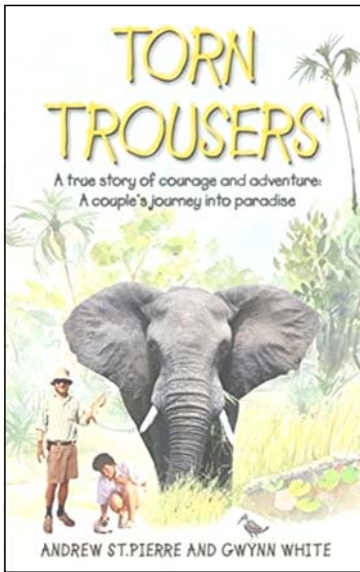
Remember to keep warm this winter. I think it is going to be a cold one. Until next time.

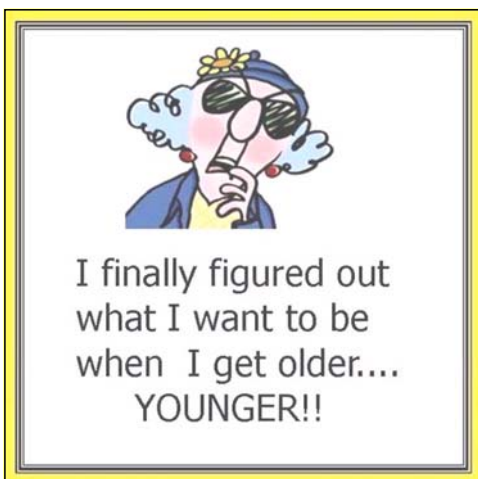

BE AWARE OF BOGUS COPS

Police in Randburg policing precinct have recently noted with concern the number of hijackings in certain intersections. More especially along Malibongwe and N1 both on and off ramps, William Nicol, both on and off ramps, including the stretch of N1 North and South between Malibongwe and William Nicol roads.

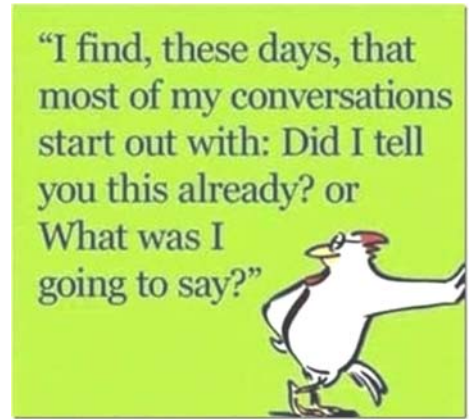

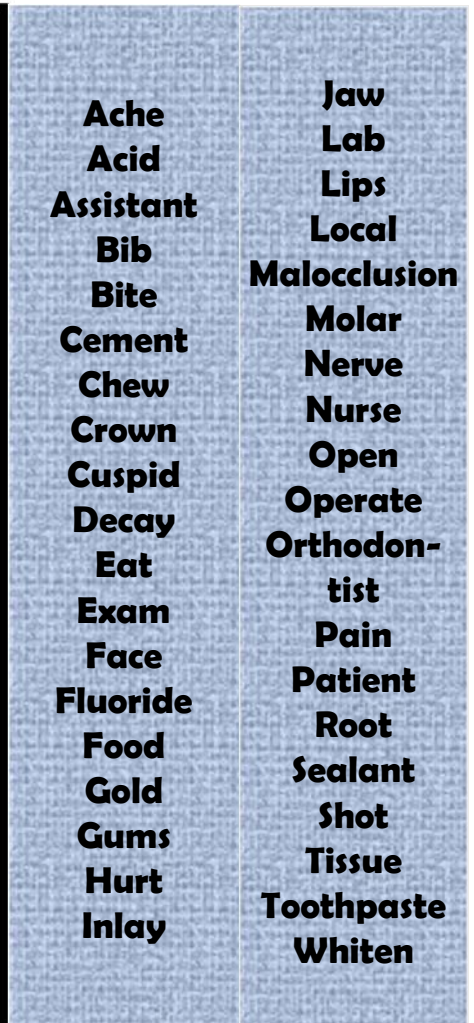

Voyage to the Stars

Hurling on into deep space at a phenomenal speed of 51 500 kilometers per hour (km/h) is NASA's New Horizons space probe as it heads onwards on its journey to explore the outer reaches of our solar system and beyond.

Launched from Cape Canaveral in Florida, USA on January 19, 2006, the less than 3-meters in length spacecraft completed a dramatic flypast (lasting just hours) of the planet Pluto and its five moons on July 14, 2015, completing a nine and-a-half year first stage of its voyage and covering some 4,8 billion kilometers (km).

My late Father (1886 – 1963) had a very keen interest in astronomy. I well remember when I was about nine years of age, his telling me about the existence of a ninth planet from the sun named Pluto after the Greek god of the underworld. The discovery of Pluto by American astronomer Clyde Tombaugh at the Lowell Observatory in Arizona, USA, was announced to the world on 18th February 1930.

Probably as a chip off the old block, I too have developed and maintain an enthusiastic fascination for astronomy and space exploration.

To put matters into perspective, Pluto is

on the outer edge of our solar system. Earth is 150 million kms from the sun and orbits the sun once every 365 days. Pluto, on the other hand, takes 248 Earth years to circle the sun once following an Elliptical Orbit ranging between 4.4 billion kms (at its closest point to the sun) and 7.4 billion kms (at its furthest location from the sun).

Pluto was initially classified as a planet. However, pursuant to subsequent analysis, research and debate on the term "planet", the Astronomical Authorities were of the opinion that Pluto met only two of the three primary requirements to comply with the definition of planet. In 2006, Pluto was downgraded to a "dwarf" planet. Pluto is smaller than the Earth's moon.

On rendezvousing with Pluto, New Horizons transmitted back to mission control detailed images giving us the first close-up view of the most distant world ever reached up to that time.]] Spectacular pictures along with data received show the surface of the planet to be covered mostly by nitrogen ice with small quantities of frozen methane and carbon monoxide, held firm by a temperature of -230 degrees Celsius.

After achieving its flypast of Pluto the

New Horizons spacecraft course was altered to enable it to pass close to a recently discovered belt of celestial objects, known as the Kuiper Belt Objects (KBOs). The spacecraft made a successful flyby of these KBOs on 1 January 2019.

Astronomer Clyde Tombaugh died in 1997. According to reports, aboard the New Horizons probe are his ashes which, in my view, is a wonderful tribute to the man who discovered Pluto.

Meanwhile the spacecraft continues its search for even more celestial bodies which might come within the field of its flight path; it is estimated that the New Horizons' functionality will carry on until at least 2034. □

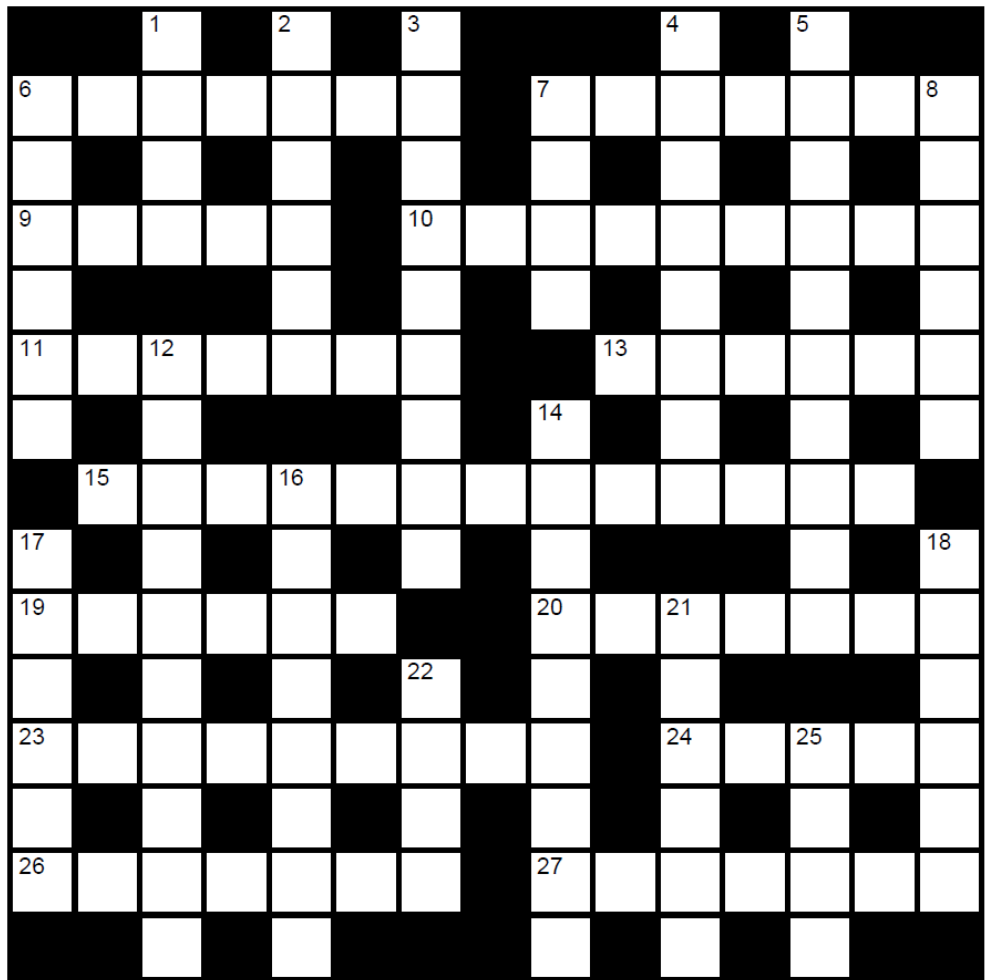

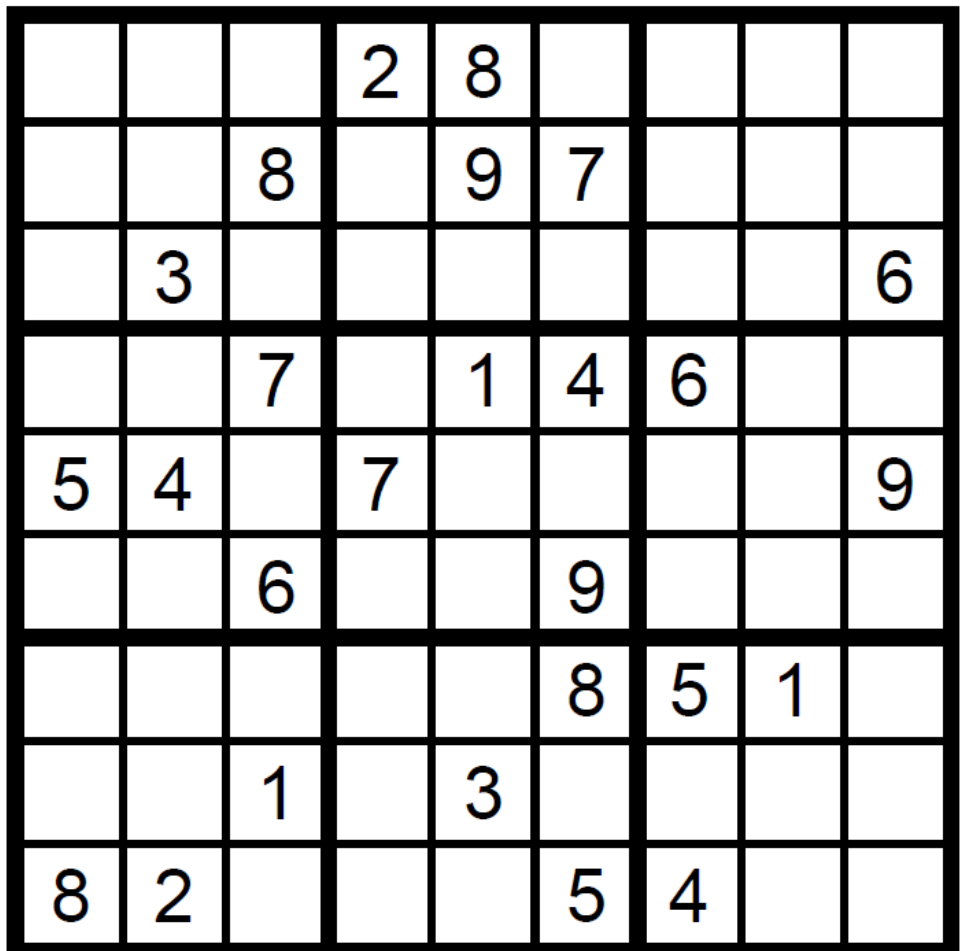

Fanouropita Cake

Have you lost anything lately? Your keys, your glasses, your patience at the office?

Well, the Greeks have a cure for that: fanouropita, which is a very tasty vegan cake which you bake and share with friends and neighbours. It brings luck and optimizes one's chances of finding the lost item.

A very easy and simple recipe that requires no special equipment or electric mixer for everyone to try out.

Ingredients

3 cups cake flour
2tsp baking powder
1 cup oil
1/2 cup orange juice or water
1cup sugar
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp ground cloves
1 cup walnuts and raisins

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 160-170 °C.

To prepare this Greek fanouropita cake recipe, add in a large bowl the sugar and vegetable oil. Using a hand whisk beat until the sugar dissolves.

In a separate bowl, combine the orange juice with the baking soda and mix with a fork until the baking soda froths and dissolves completely.

Add the orange juice and baking soda mixture to the bowl with the sugar and oil. Whisk thoroughly using a hand whisk or an electric mixer.

In another bowl add the flour, ground cinnamon, ground clove, raisins and chopped walnuts. Mix using a wooden spoon.

Add the flour mixture to the liquid mixture, a little bit at a time, whilst whisking. Mix until the ingredients are completely combined and the mixture is

smooth like a thick batter.

Transfer the mixture for the fanouropita to a round oiled baking pan 28cm in diameter and bake for 45-60 minutes, depending on the oven. To check if the fanouropita is ready stick a toothpick in the cake. If the toothpick comes out clean then it is ready. If not bake a little longer and check again.

Leave the fanouropita to cool down completely before removing the pan. Serve the fanouropita after having sprinkled with icing sugar. □

Matters Historical I

It staggers me to realize that both my parents were born in the 19th century!! My father (Arthur Stanley Rolfe) was born in 1886 and my mother (Dorothy Agnes Frances Lucy) in 1899. (I feel I should be teetering on 100 myself but have a way to go yet)!! One of my cousins, Alan William Rolfe F.S.G., was a genealogist by profession and he traced our family tree back to the year 1600. It only petered out then due to the great fire in London, which destroyed all previous records. I had a wonderful professional photograph of my father, taken when he was about 2 years old, which I have treasured all my life, and when I went to look for this article, it has mysteriously disappeared from amongst all other family photos!! I am quite distraught. It showed my father sitting on a high-legged chair, staring into the camera. In those days, little boys wore dresses, so my father was wearing a white broidery anglaise dress, with a broad sash around his waist, and his hair was combed up into a long curl from the back of his head to his forehead! A priceless photograph!

There's a skeleton in our family history as well, but that skeleton produced a war heroine! Cousin Alan's father, George Samuel Blackburn Rolfe was a bigamist. This fact only came to light upon his father's death. His father's business as a Chartered Accountant took him on business between Paris and London and he would spend some weeks/months at a

time in each place. Alan could still remember the day his father came home and announced that he would not be returning to England to live with them. Unbeknownst to them he had already married his lover and they had started a family. On April 26, 1914, they produced twin daughters, Lilian Verna Rolfe and Helen Fedora Rolfe. During the 2nd world war, while living with her parents (who at that time were in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil), Lilian volunteered to return to England and train for service with the French Resistance. (Incidentally, in one of his letters to me, Alan related that his best friend at school, James Douglas Chisholm, served with Special Operations Executive during the war and he would have instructed these women on how to operate their radio sets)!! Lilian was arrested by the Germans at Montargis, France, in 1944 and was sent to the notorious concentration camp at Ravensbruck, where she was put to death, together with Violette Szabo and Denise Bloch, on or about 5 February 1945. The French Government awarded her the Croix de Guerre before the news of her death was confirmed.

These war heroines were also honoured in Lambeth, England. During World War II, more than 4,000 Lambeth houses were destroyed by bombing and another 38,000 were damaged. When the Lambeth Council began clearing the sites of damaged properties, they decided that

one of the new developments, the Vincennes Estate in West Norwood, should commemorate WWII heroines of the French Resistance. As two of these brave women (Lilian and Violette) had links with Lambeth, they named a house after Lilian Rolfe and erected a stark memorial to the lives of these four women from the Special Operations Executive – Denise Madeline Bloch, Lilian Verna Rolfe, Violette Szabo and Cecily Margot Lefort – who lost their lives in Ravensbruck concentration camp in 1945.

In June 1993, Alan was invited by the Special Forces Club, to fly to Berlin for a special commemoration service at Ravensbruck. He travelled over with his nephew and his half-sister, Helen and met Tania Szabo and many others who were directly concerned with the Resistance, including the famous Odette Hallowes and Vera Atkins, who supervised the training of the girls and spent many months in Germany after the war trying to find out exactly what had happened to the three "Buckmaster" girls. In his letter, Alan stated he would never forget the poignancy of the lone piper and the music floating out over the lake. It was hard to believe that a few yards away from that spot, over 90,000 women and children were put to death.

More to write about the Rolfe family so there's an Historical 2 waiting in the wings. □ *Marjorie Hutchison*

Review: Foldy Easy Rollator



As many have noticed, I now have a new rollator and have had enquiries about it. It is a Foldy Easy Folding Lightweight Rollator (price R2750). As its name suggests, it is a fold flat model.

Two days after I ordered it on the internet site of The Independent Lifestyle Company in Cape Town, it was delivered to me by courier. It was delivered to me folded in a box. Even then it was a fairly chunky item but still it would fit in the boot of a small car.

Unfolding it turned out to be something of a mission. The instruction manual is not particularly clear and does not show how to fold it back again. Either way it is a two person job. However, I found that it could be folded partly and would still only occupy half of the back seat of a Hyundai i10. This is a big improvement on standard rollators. Other than that, I am very happy with it.

It is well constructed and using it is a joy. The front bag has ample space and it is quiet and smooth in use. It weighs 8kg and is available in a wide range of colours including pink!

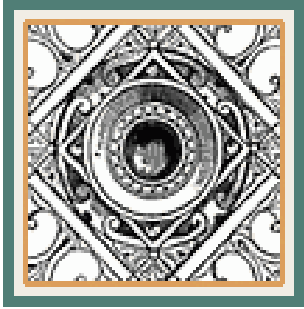

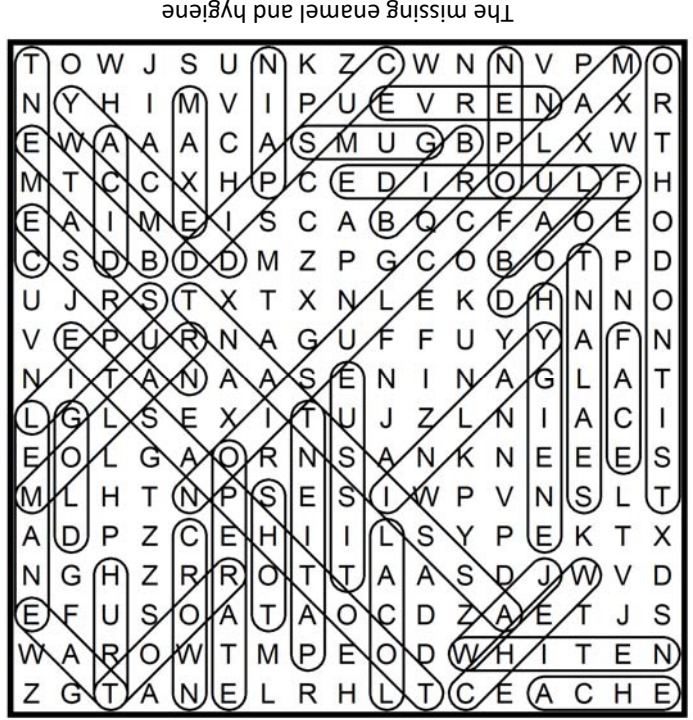
